From the Pastor



By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. -- Galatians 5:22-25

Trinity's children, youth and others have been working hard on items for the fund raiser. Thank you in advance for all your hard work.



Dear Friends of Seafarers -

I have said it many times before, but it is so true, when you have seen one ship, you have seen one ship. Some are big, some are smaller, some are old and some are newer, some are clean and some really show their wear and of course there is always a wide variety of nationalities from all over the world. Some speak English and some don't, some have visas and others don't. Well, I could go on and on but you get the idea.

I was very surprise recently when I had a call from port security that there were already crew waiting at the gate to go shopping and could I please come and pick them up. I was surprised because the ship had docked earlier that morning and most seafarers having been up all night as the ship came through Long Island Sound are tired and waiting for CBP and Coast Guard to come on board so shopping usually happens a little later. But I guess not having been able to have shore leave for many months they planned to take full advantage of a chance to get off the ship. However, that is not what surprised me the most. I was surprised to find a female cadet in the mix.



Then the next ship, surprise, surprise, had 2 female cadets. These 3 young women were from the Philippines and I learned that many Filipino women are beginning to attend the maritime schools to become seafarers.



On the next ship I met 3 women seafarers from Poland. Wow! One, the 3nd officer told me that she was engaged to the 2nd officer, that they had met 7 years ago at the maritime college and when they went home later this summer they were to be married. She said that she and her husband would be able to sail on the same ships.

On one of the shopping trips, I took the captain and 2 of the women. The girls wanted to go to Walmart and the captain to Dick's to buy golf clubs. I asked him how he enjoyed the female crew. Laughing he told me this story. The C/O worried, had come and asked if he had noticed that the ship was using a lot more fresh water than usual. The captain said yes, he had noticed that. He said that it was not just because the girls used more water taking showers but he had noticed that the men were also cleaning up more not only taking more showers but also washing their clothes more often. Yes, I did notice that even their coveralls were really clean.



On July 17 we will be celebrating Christmas in July here at Trinity. It is not too early to start thinking about filling a Christmas-at-Sea satchel for a seafarer this Christmas. Monetary donations are gratefully accepted for items to fill a satchel: a sweatshirt, t-shirt, socks and knit hat. Or in your shopping over the summer keep your eye on the lookout for these items that may be on sale. Satchels will be provided and put together in the Fall.

For those <u>not</u> vaccinated for COVID, <u>highly consider receiving the</u> <u>vaccine but always consult with your Dr first.</u>

Protect yourself, your family, friends and others.

Children ages 6 months - 5 years have now been <u>approved</u> to receive the Moderna or Pfizer <u>vaccines</u>.

Ages 5 years -17 have been eligible to receive the <u>Pfizer vaccine and also the Pfizer booster</u> 5 months after their last vaccine.(<u>Moderna may be approved for ages 6-17 any day</u>)

Ages 6 months-64 years(esp. males 12yr - 39yr)may want to wait 8 weeks between the <u>2 vaccine doses</u>(Pfizer or Moderna) that may increase your protection and to minimize the rare risk of heart problems. <u>Johnson&Johnson</u> is recommended 2 months after your initial shot for ages 18+ <u>but is advised at this time to use Pfizer or Moderna</u> due to some rare blood clot issues with the J&J. The <u>Boosters</u> don't have to be the same brand as the original Covid vaccine.

The Pfizer and Moderna <u>Boosters</u> are recommended 5 months after your 2nd vaccine for **all adults**.

A **2nd** <u>booster</u> for anyone 50+, 12 years+ who are moderately to severely immunocompromised are eligible 4 months after the 1st booster. 18 years+ who received both the J&J vaccine and booster are eligible after 4 months.

Go to vaccines.gov to find a location near you, text your zip code to 438829 or call 1-800-232-0233. Many pharmacies have available appointments also.

Any <u>homebound member</u> can call 211, your Dr. or go to the vaccine portal at; ct.gov/covidvaccine and you can register there to receive the vaccine or booster in your home.

Stay safe and the CDC <u>recommends</u> a if anyone has symptoms, a positive test(need to quarantine), been exposed to someone with Covid and on public transportation.
