Dear Friends of Seafarers -

I hate to shop! Well, I mean for me, I hate to shop especially for clothing. Lately, I continue to find myself doing a lot of shopping for seafarers. Through the pandemic it was a no brainer that seafarers were not allowed shore leave but another result of the pandemic is that seafarers have not been able to renew their visas, no visa no shore leave and so I find myself going off ships with lots of shopping requests. So, I started Sunday night on the Best Buy website looking at the electronic items requested to see what was available in the store either in North Haven or in Orange and then ordering an item online hopefully getting it sent to me before the ship was scheduled to sail. Monday morning, I was at Best buy when it opened. I purchased some items and paid for a laptop that I had to go to Orange to pick up. Getting to Orange I was told that while I was buying the item in North Haven the last laptop was being sold at their store. OK, wow, but now I had to go back to the North Haven store to be refunded the money. At North Haven I repurchased the laptop to be shipped to me, hopefully, the next day.

Over he next several days I made multiple trips to Walmarts in New Haven, Wallingford and Saw Mill Road, Targets in North Haven and Orange, Stop & Shop and BJ's.

Seafarers had sent me pictures of other things they hoped for, toys to bring home to their children, clothing and baseball type hats, chocolates, vitamins, tooth paste and shampoo, cookies and chips, pringles, foot powder and deodorant.

I returned to the ship every night loaded with the days purchases and I was always met with great excitement. Everyone had to see what I had bought. One seafarer had asked me to buy him a phone. He showed me his phone that was broken. He had not been able to contact his family in 2 months, he was desperate. I got a big smile and big hug as I pulled the phone out of my bag and handed it to him. And yes, seeing someone happy makes me happy too. I hope you might consider filling a Christmas-at-Sea satchel that will bring joy to seafarers far away from home and family during Christmas. I have plenty of bags, see me after church, call or email me for information or speak to Pat.

For those <u>not</u> vaccinated for COVID, <u>highly consider receiving</u> the <u>vaccine but always consult with your Dr first.</u>

Protect yourself, your family, friends and others.

The <u>updated Booster</u> just approved for ages 12yrs -17yrs is Pfizer only and ages 18+yrs can get either the **updated Pfizer or Moderna boosters with both age groups waiting at least 2 months after the 2nd primary vaccine or last booster.

Children **ages 6m - 17 yrs** are <u>approved</u> to receive the <u>Moderna or Pfizer vaccines</u>. No booster is approved for ages 6yrs-11yrs if they received the Moderna vaccine.

Ages 5 yrs -11 yrs are eligible to receive the Pfizer booster 5 months after their last Pfizer vaccine. No booster is approved for ages 6m- 4yrs.

Ages 6m - 64 years(esp. males 12yr - 39yr)may want to wait 8 weeks between the <u>2 vaccine doses</u> since that may increase your protection and to minimize the rare risk of heart problems.

For ages 18+ it is advised at this time to use the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines instead of the Johnson&Johnson due to some rare blood clot issues. **Novavax** has been available also, currently only as a vaccine and for ages 18+ requiring 2 primary doses.

Anyone with a moderate to severe immunocompromised condition should check with their Dr. for the recommended vaccine and booster schedule.

Go to vaccines.gov to find a location near you, text your zip code to 438829 or call 1-800-232-0233. Many pharmacies have available appointments also.

Any <u>homebound member</u> can call 211, your Dr. or go to the vaccine portal at; ct.gov/covidvaccine and you can register there to receive the vaccine or booster in your home.

Stay safe and the CDC <u>recommends</u> a if anyone has symptoms, a positive test(need to quarantine), been exposed to someone with Covid and on public transportation.
