November is here, and as we look to the Thanksgiving Day holiday on November 24 we are once again reminded of how much we all have to be thankful for. As Christians we not only count our many blessings, but gladly confess him who gave them all to us, saying "Thanks be to God!"

Martin Luther's "Small Catechism" reminds us of all God's generosity to us: "God daily and abundantly provides...my body and soul, eyes, ears and all limbs and senses," but also the blessings of "shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and home, spouse and children...along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life." And as if that wasn't enough, God has also given us the most precious gift of all, his only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord: "He has purchased and freed me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the

devil, not with gold or silver, but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death." For all these blessings, we sing a hymn of thanksgiving to God every Sunday at Trinity right after Communion: "Thank the Lord and sing his praise, tell everyone what he has done." ### **Seafarers International House**

Dear Friends of Seafarers –

I received a call that 3 crew wanted to go to Walmart. I recognized them as their ship had been here about a month ago and they had bought a lot of food items from Walmart. When they got into the van, yes, they wanted to go to Walmart but was there a grocery that sold larger quantities of things. "Like what and how much" I asked? "Well, like potatoes, not little bags, bigger bags, maybe like 50 Kgs." Well, to make a long story short, I took them to the warehouse and the van was soon loaded with 500lbs of potatoes, 50 lbs. of cabbage, onions, tomatoes, cucumber, apples, carrots, and other fruits and vegetables. Then we went to BJ's where they bought over \$1000 worth of meat, cheese, and butter. They were shopping for 20 hungry crew so the cook was happy that he had a lot of good food to cook.



I met with a Greek captain on another ship. He had a young lady with him and I was not introduced to her and so I wasn't sure if she was his daughter, wife or crew. He was the only person on the ship with a visa and he wanted to go shopping at 1300 the next day. He said that the girl was having a birthday in a few weeks and he wanted to get a lot of party things for her to celebrate. He also wondered if he bought a birthday cake and froze it if it would be fresh and then he thought about buying a cake mix. The girl wanted chocolate.

So the next day I picked the captain up and we headed to Walmart. I finally learned that the girl was a cadet on the ship but that she was his 2<sup>nd</sup> cousin. He had asked his company if she could do her training on his ship so he could watch out for her. She would be 19 on her birthday. He did not want me to just leave him at Walmart but asked me to shop with him so I could steer him in the right direction for things he wanted. He decided on a chocolate fudge cake mix and not understanding the size one mix would make, he bought 2. Then he bought 2 cans of chocolate frosting and a container

of chocolate sprinkles. Lots of chocolate! We spent about 2 hours shopping for many other items for himself and the chief engineer who was also Greek and I returned him to the ship. He loaded everything in my wagon and that was the last I saw of him.



That night returned to visit with the crew who had asked me to do some shopping for them. I got their lists and went home to see what I could order on amazon and what would hopefully be delivered before the ship sailed. The next day I went back to Walmart for orders of 27 bags of Doritos, cartons of coke, tooth paste, mouth wash, oreos, ramen noodles, pringles, bread, 20 cans of tuna, 30 cans of sardines and 6 cans of corned beef.



Then a trip to the mall for Victoria Secret spray mist. I also bought glucosamine chondroitin and laxatives. It took me 3 trips with my wagon to get everything on the ship and about 4 hours to figure out and collect all the money. At 2200 they asked if there was still time for me to shop before their ship sailed the next day at 1300. The next morning I jumped out of bed and "flew" to the store for vitamins, more cartons of coke, ramen noodles and Dunkin Donuts. Mission accomplished just in time as the pilot and linesmen arrived. PHEW!!!!



#### **ELEANOR HERPICH SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Eleanor Herpich Scholarships are funded from the annual income received from Miss Herpich's bequest to Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church (TLC). The total amount for the scholarships is \$3000 each year. While the intent is to award 3 - \$1000 scholarships, the Scholarship Committee may distribute the money as it feels is appropriate and, depending on the number of applicants may choose to make awards of less money to a larger number of applicants (i.e. \$500 each to 6 applicants) or to make larger awards to a smaller number of applicants (i.e. \$1500 each to 2 applicants). In addition to the \$3000 from the Herpich Endowment, any money donated to special funds for scholarships will be added to the available funds. Any money awarded may not exceed the total charges for tuition, books and required supplies.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE**

The scholarship committee comprises:

- Pastor of TLC
- President of TLC Church Council
- Chairperson of TLC Finance Committee

The availability of the scholarships will be announced each year in the September, October, and November editions of the Trinity Window. Applicants must submit a letter of application discussing their educational program and sense of vocational goals. Requests for a scholarship must be received no later than November 15. (In cases where November 15 falls on a weekend the date will be extended to the following Monday.) Any request(s) received after this date will not be considered. The Scholarship Committee will meet before the end of November to determine the scholarship awards. The proposed awards will be presented for endorsement at the December Church Council meeting. The recipients will then be contacted and informed of their selection to receive a scholarship. Recipients of the scholarships will be announced in the January Trinity Window and in the TLC Annual Report. The scholarships will be presented to the recipients during Sunday worship in January.

#### RECIPIENT QUALIFICATIONS

- Current active member of TLC in good standing (must have communed and made a donation of record to TLC within the past year).
- Must be enrolled as a full or part time, non-stipended student in a post high school technical, undergraduate or graduate program.

If a recipient has received 2 scholarship awards they must wait 2 years before being eligible for another scholarship, however, an exception may be made in cases where there are no other candidates. In all cases requests from applicants who have not received a previous award will receive preference over previous recipients. Any scholarship money not awarded will be carried over into the following years' pool of available money.

### REMINDER - DON'T FORGET YOUR FLU VACCINE!



For those <u>not</u> vaccinated for COVID, <u>highly consider receiving the</u> <u>vaccine but always consult with your Dr first.</u>

\*\*Protect yourself, your family, friends and others.\*\*

Ages 6 months and older can receive the Moderna or Pfizer vaccines. For ages 18+ it is advised at this time to use the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines instead of the Johnson&Johnson due to some rare blood clot issues. Novavax has also been available, currently only as a vaccine and for ages 18+ requiring 2 primary doses.

**Ages 6m - 64 years**(esp. males 12yr - 39yr)may want to wait 8 weeks between the <u>2 vaccine doses</u> since that may increase your protection and to minimize the rare risk of heart problems.

No booster is approved for children 4yrs and younger.

\*Children age 5 years are now recommended to receive 1 updated Pfizer booster(bivalent) waiting 2 months after completing the primary vaccine series or last monovalent booster.

\*Ages 6 yrs and older are now <u>recommended to receive 1 updated Pfizer or Moderna booster</u>(bivalent) waiting 2 months after completing the primary vaccine series or last monovalent booster.

Anyone with a moderate to severe immunocompromised condition should check with their Dr. for the recommended vaccine and booster schedule.

Go to vaccines.gov to find a location near you, text your zip code to 438829 or call 1-800-232-0233. Many pharmacies have available appointments also.

Any <u>homebound member</u> can call 211, your Dr. or go to the vaccine portal at; ct.gov/covidvaccine and you can register there to receive the vaccine or booster in your home.

Stay safe and the CDC <u>recommends</u> a if anyone has symptoms, a positive test(need to quarantine), been exposed to someone with Covid and on public transportation.
