Our goal is to bring this to the accountability team and come up with a plan to move forward at the pace we can at this time. Our next seminar is May 13. Remember, this is a yearlong approach.

Seafarers International House

Dear Friends of Seafarers -

The Port of New Haven has been very busy with ships unloading salt, lumber and steel products. Many of the ships have stayed a long time, some of them as long as two weeks. When they stay that long I can really get to know many of the seafarers. Once I give them the WIFI they really, really like to connect with me on whatsap or messenger. Soon I am sent message after message of things they would like to buy because without a visa they are not allowed to get off their ship.



Another ship is at a different terminal unloading steel products. They also expect to be in port a long time but half of this crew have visas. I receive a call early that some crew are waiting for me to go shopping.

Others have time off at 1300 and still others at 1800. Many of the trips for this ship are to BJ's where they are shopping for provisions for 60 days. But the seafarers also want time to shop at TJ Max, Best Buy, Dick's, Victoria Secret and Walmart.



One man tells me that he has not been off the ship for 6 months another for 4 months, how good it is to walk on solid ground and see people.



Many of these trips for both of these ships and even the others that come in seem to revolve around food. Not only do they buy provisions and snacks for themselves but we stop at McDonald's and buy 50 hamburgers and fries, another time we buy 24 Big Mac meals and another time pizza, enough for all the crew.



One Indian crew finds an Indian restaurant and enjoys eating there but also brings back enough for the crew unable to leave the ship. And each time I am offered a hamburger, a soft drink, a bag of chips, a box of donuts, a bag of chocolates It is their way of thanking me. They ask what they can pay me for my service. A happy smile and a thank you is all I ask.




