Dear Friends of Seafarers -

It happens every year, doesn't it? All of a sudden ZING and Christmas is upon us. And for me, it hopefully, means being buried in Christmas-at-Sea satchels. I know I have mentioned in the past worrying whether or not I will have enough satchels to serve the ships that come into New Haven and New London at Christmas.

All of a sudden, I am getting emails and calls that satchels will be delivered or that they are ready to be picked up. Some are calls that more satchels are needed. I am getting knit hats from knitters at a church in Hanover, NH and just had a request from a group of quilters in PA. My mind is at ease as satchels will soon fill up my living room. Last year I had a record number of 400 satchels and yes, that takes a lot of room. I am very thankful.



Over the years I have delivered satchels to ships where we had to sneak them on board and hide them as the captain was not Christian. On other ships they have been secured on board so that the crew can celebrate when out in the middle of the ocean on Dec.25.



Sometimes they have been opened right away with such excitement, like little children that just couldn't wait. Items are passed around until everyone is happy with sizes and colors. It is so much fun to watch. These gifts bring such joy to seafarers far away from their homes and families at Christmas. It means that they are remembered and honored for the work they do. How often do you think about the things that are delivered to our ports each and every day by these unseen seafarers who are often not even allowed to step on our soil. Thank you to everyone who has filled a satchel and warmed a heart and head this



A Special Message from Rev. Bonita Grubbs



"Deep gratitude with introspection" are the first words that came to mind as I reflected on my ministry as CCA's Executive Director. Having been honored - and humbled - to assume this position on December I, 1988, my intention was to be here for no more than five years. In a phone call recently, a former staff member reminded me of my "pronouncement."

Where did the time go?

Perhaps it flew by because CCA's staff and Board members had a dream and an agenda. Our commitment then was to make a difference in the lives of the individuals and families we serve. This included, and still does involve, offering emergency assistance, and seeking funding for and implementing supportive, strengthening programming such as:

- Neighborhood Assistance offering emergency food, energy assistance, information and referral services, short-term motel assistance, and other areas of urgent, basic needs;
- Emergency Housing giving 17 families that were homeless the chance to receive support services and an apartment for 60-90 days, or until they could move to permanent housing;
- o Grassroots advocacy and civil engagement/educational initiatives that were designed to influence public policy and, in the words of our initial mission statement, "to change systems that perpetuate poverty and injustice."

What have we done lately?

CCA staff and Board members made a programmatic shift to seek more permanent family and transformative solutions such as our Stepping Stone Transitional Housing Program. It opened in 1998, to serve 18 families that were homeless or at risk of homelessness, and needed employment, family support and stable housing. A total of 250 families were able to secure permanent and stable housing over a 20-year period through this Program.



What have we done lately? (continued)

In 2022, due to a kind and most generous donor, and in partnership with the Housing Authority of New Haven/Elm City Communities, CCA launched the New HOPE (Higher Opportunities, Purpose and Expectations) Housing Program - a Moving-to-Work pilot program.

Today, this Program offers needed support to, and the opportunity for, families to be in residence for up to three years. The objective is that heads of household can and will secure employment, increase their income, and improve the quality of life for their children.

This year, one of CCA's recent partnerships was with Where Angels Play, to design and install the Kathy Carroll Playground, to promote and encourage family time and exercise.

One of our most celebrated moments was envisioning and implementing the ARISE (Accessing Resources for Independence, Skill-building and Employment) Center - which was established in 2015. This Center offers person-centered support to heads of household in the areas of employment and child and family services.

This also includes advancing the work of CCA's Advocacy and Education Project, which is designed to change systems that perpetuate poverty and injustice. This focuses attention on the issues that people confront, such as the lack of affordable housing, jobs that do not pay a living wage, and discrimination based on racial background.

What do we hope to do in the future?

Our vision is to expand and enhance CCA's existing programs to serve even more people, to make a lasting difference, by ensuring all positions are staffed and all programs can be fully funded going into 2024, to ease the path to independence for people receiving services.

Thank you for the ways that you have supported us in the past. You can help us continue to make a lasting, personal and transformative difference of offering HELP, HOUSING AND HOPE - that is our mission - to people and families in need in New Haven.
